WHY DO DOGS END UP IN A SHELTER?

Dogs arrive at shelters for different reasons, including:

- Growth: As puppies turn to pooches they can outgrow their homes making care difficult in smaller dwellings
- Neglect: Abuse and abandonment
- Owner's health: Illness, age and death means owners can no longer care for dogs
- Cost: food, veterinary costs and toys can add up



HARD COSTS FOR SHELTERS

It costs approximately \$250 to care for a dog during its first month at a shelter. That includes:

- **№** \$120 Average cost of sterilization
- \$40 Exams and basic vaccinations
- \$30 De-worming and flea prevention
- **№** \$10 Toys and treats

REASONS WHY SHELTER DOGS RULE

- **Health:** Shelter dogs receive a clean bill of health from shelter vets They are already spayed or neutered and have all their shots up-to-date.
- **Companionship**: Scientists have found that those who own a cat or dog are better able to deal with everyday life stresses.
- Finding your match: Your local shelter will work with you to choose the right dog to fit your lifestyle, whether it be a high-energy puppy who could use the affection of a large family or a laid back mature dog perfect for empty nesters.



BRINGING HOME YOUR NEW PAL

Consider these tips before bringing a dog into your home:

- **Food**: Choose a brand such as Pedigree® that offers complete nutrition for your dog. Use snacks and treats to bond with your dog.
- **Space**: Dogs require a lot of space. Consider fencing off your backyard and ensure you have areas to exercise your dog. Ensure there is a special place for your pooch indoors as well, such as a bed or a crate.
